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Cryosurgery (Freezing)

- 1. Immediately following treatment, you will note the development of redness and swelling. It is common for a blister to form.
- 2. Clear or blood tinged fluid may drain from the treatment site for several days. This is normal. This drainage should be wiped away gently with tissue. You may use a sterilized needle to pop the blister and squeeze out the fluid, but leave the skin intact.
- 3. The site may be washed with mild soap and water then covered with Vaseline.
- 4. It is best to keep the treatment area moist and not allow a hard scab to form. If a scab occurs, do not remove it. It will fall off on its own.
- 5. Treated areas on the face heal in 1-2 weeks. Treated areas on the neck, chest, back and extremities may take 1-2 months to heal completely.
- 6. When areas are treated around the eye, swelling of the eyelids on one or both sides are quite common and may last for several days.
- 7. When areas are treated on the temple or scalp, a headache may result, lasting 15-30 minutes.

 Occasionally these occur several days following treatment. In most cases, Tylenol can be taken for pain. Sometimes a loss of color occurs, this is usually temporary.
